CLEAN UP DAY AND HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE DROP OFF (BUSINESS WASTE WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED) SATURDAY, November 4, 2023 - PUBLIC WORKS BUILDING 16 BUDDTOWN ROAD - 8 A.M. TO NOON

- Latex and oil-based paints, paint solvents, aerosols, driveway sealers, antifreeze, batteries, lighting ballasts (must be removed from fixture), smoke detectors, and thermostats
- Product must be in sealed containers leaking containers will be refused
- No waste oil, pesticides, herbicides, fungicides or pool chemicals
- · Proof of residency is required.
- Dumpsters will be available for yard and household debris but not for demolished buildings.

Burlington County is seeking input for the 2024 Hazard Mitigation Plan. The plan will address the County's risks posed by hazards (e.g., flood, drought, winter storms) and identify specific strategies to help reduce or eliminate risks.



- Set out recycling by 6am. Metal bar must face street.
- Cardboard must be emptied, flattened, and folded.
- If cardboard doesn't fit in container, stack it loosely and neatly next to container.
- Do not jam cardboard into cart. Doing so may result in the cart not being fully emptied.
- Never use boxes to hold ANY recyclables.

To benefit the historic Vincentown library

After 100 years of service, the Sally Stretch Keen Memorial Library in Vincentown needs your help. Some crucial repairs to our historic building will keep our books dry and our doors open. To make this happen, we applied for and won a matching NJ Historic Trust Grant. This is a real honor. It means the Trust recognizes the importance of our building's architecture, history, and role as your community library. We are thrilled to be preserving our historic building, but a matching grant means that we need our community to help us raise our share after the grant award, which is \$57,000.

This \$57,000.00 is in addition to our normal, annual fundraising. The Sally is a full service library with access to County resources, but did you know that the township and the county only provide a portion of our operating costs? Every year we depend on donations from people like you to help us pay our staff, keep the lights and the water on, put on our wonderful programs...and of course, purchase books. We are committed to promoting literacy and bringing our community together, but we can't do it without you.

Your engraved brick will be a permanent show of your support for our building preservation and all that we do in our community. Bricks will line the library walkway and will be a lasting reminder that the library belongs to all of us. We thank you for becoming a part of our legacy!


